Sun ... Heat... Danger ...

With the coming of the warmer months there are a few pointers that will ensure that we all stay "cool" for summer.

Animals can easily become overheated if left in cars, even with windows open. A dog or any other animal should never be left in a car on a hot day. Always allow your pets access

Never leave a dog or any other pet in a

to a cool shady area with a plentiful supply of water. Closed conservatories, in particular, can reach oven like temperatures. Shaded areas should also be provided for rabbit and guinea pig hutches. The amount of time that an animals sun-bathesn should always be regulated. White eared cats may need to have sun block applied to help prevent ear cancer. Exercise for both pets and humans alike is always better in the cooler morning or evening air.

Rabbits and other small furries should be checked for fly strike twice daily to ensure fur is clean, dry and not matted. If you see any signs of maggots contact your vet immediately.

Vigilance is also required to check ears and coats for grass seeds and other nibbly things. Please ask your vet for advice.



Modern vaccines, advances in veterinary medicine and improvements in pet nutrition provide some of the reasons that our pets live longer.

There is a huge range of life style diets now available. Animals require different levels of nutrients and energy at different stages of their lives and these diets are tailored to provide this.

Young animals need higher levels of proteins and fatty acids whilst mature cats and dogs do not require these nutrients at such a high level. With older dogs and cats diets are formulated to reduce the burden on organs such as the liver and kidneys which may not be functioning quite so well. Feeding your pet the correct life stage diet can make a huge difference to their health. Please ask your vet for further information.

At this time of year one of our most distinctive

native mammals, the badger, can be seen. They are a member of the weasel family with the boars ranging in weight from 9 to 16kg and the sows from 6 to 14kg. Badgers live in communal burrows which have often been occupied for generations. Cubs are generally born in February with one to four in a litter. The cubs do not usually venture out till May.

Badgers are omnivores eating anything from earthworms (probably their mainstay throughout the year) to berries

There are many different types all with distinctive colours and markings. The bulk of their diet consists of cereals and good mixes are available. Food should be clean and dry. Plastic bowels and cages made of wood should be avoided due to their love of chewing. Many varieties of cage are with multi level available cages providing interest but care should be taken with tubes as hamsters can become stuck. Exercise is extremely important and any wheels must have a solid floor and be big enough so the hamster

does not have to bend its back. Treats can be hidden to encourage foraging. Always handle a hamster when it is fully awake and allow it to sniff you before picking up by cupping in the palms of two hands. Hamsters can suffer from a variety of illnesses ranging from diarrhoea, constipation, wet tail to overgrown nails and teeth. Please consult your vet if you have any worries.
